XML Parsing and Service Codes

There are several different techniques and tools available for parsing XML. Intershipper recommends that you follow the protocols laid out by the W3C organization (<u>http://www.w3.org/XML/</u>). It is not recommended that you reference any of the XML objects by the service codes. The service codes can and do change. The above-described USPS update is a perfect example of when new service codes come into play and deprecated service codes go away.

Referencing Intershipper.com with an IP Address

It is highly unadvisable to reference the Intershipper server with an IP address. Rather, please use the Intershipper domain, Intershipper.com. By using the Intershipper domain address, you are ensured that no matter what hardware upgrades are made to the Intershipper servers, your system will always be connected to Intershipper, even if the Intershipper IP addresses change.

Overview

InterShipper is a web service delivering accurate shipping-rate aggregation. The "XML via HTTP Interface" has been specifically designed to allow users quick and easy access to our high-speed, quote-engine server.

There are three primary steps involved in interfacing with the Intershipper engine...

- 1. Create an HTTP connection
- 2. Send request parameters via POST method
- 3. Parse XML-formatted response string

It's that simple! Here's a graphical representation of how Intershipper works...

Implementation

Below is a non-programming-language-specific outline of how to easily interface into the Intershipper rate engine using an HTTP POST request.

1. Create the HTTP connection

The specifics of creating a connection vary per language; however, the URL path and program name will not. Be sure to specify the following in order to invoke the proper program...

Note: Non-secure HTTP is also supported.

2. Send request parameters via POST method

Below is an example of what your request parameter string will look like syntactically. The order is unimportant; however, all key/value sets must be present – even if the value is "blank" or

"empty string". Also note that any data exceeding maximum-length constraints will be automatically truncated.

Request Breakdown...

"Version=2.0.0.0" +

Specifies the API version number.

"&ShipmentID=1234" +

With each rate lookup, a unique ID is generated and assigned by the quote engine. This ID is used to differentiate between "lookups of the same request" versus "lookups of differing requests". This provides callers the ability to refresh client pages repeatedly without worry of decrementing their allocated number of lookups. This parameter will have one of two possible values; either it will be blank or it will contain an ID from a prior lookup.

"&QueryID=YourQueryCode" +

This is your internal code for identifying a particular lookup. The maximum length of this particular field is 15 characters.

"&Username=YourUsername" +

This is your Intershipper account username. It has a 25-character maximum length restriction.

"&Password=YourPassword" +

This is your Intershipper account password, which also has a 25-character maximum length restriction.

"&TotalCarriers=2" +

An integer representation of the total number of carriers.

"&CarrierCode1=USP" +

"&CarrierAccount1=123456789" +

"&CarrierInvoiced1=1" +

The "TotalCarriers" value will dictate the number of times this section of code iterates. Beginning with "1", simply append a "counter" to the end of each parameter key ("CarrierCode", "CarrierAccount", and "CarrierInvoiced"). If applicable, also specify your carrier account number in order to take advantage of any special discounts or offers. Also be sure to specify whether or not you are invoiced directly from the carrier ("CarrierInvoiced" takes a boolean value of "0" or "1"). Currently supported carriers include the following...

Indicates the date that the package will be shipped and accepted into the carrier system. If the specified date exceeds 7 days from the current date or is prior to the current date an error will be returned. If the specified date is a Sunday it will be changed to the following Monday. If the specified date is a Saturday, applicable Saturday pickup charges will be applied to the final rate. If no shipping date is provided, the value will be defaulted to current date, or the following Monday if the

current date is a Saturday or Sunday. Format of the value is a string of 10 characters in the following format: MM/DD/YYYY.

"&SortBy=Carrier" +

Specifies the method to be used for sorting the rates. Three sorting methods are supported, Carrier, Rate and Delivery Date. By setting the SortBy element equal to one of these values, the following result is achieved:

- Carrier sorts the rate quote results for each service level by the carrier associated with that service
- o Rate sorts the results in descending order by the final cost of each rate quote
- DeliveryDate sorts the results by the arrival date calculated for each rate quote

The allowed values for the SortBy element include the following:

- \circ Carrier
- o Rate
- DeliveryDate

"&TotalPackages=1" +

Specifies the total number of packages. This value will dictate the number of times all package-specific sub-nodes will iterate. Beginning with "1", simply append a "counter" to the end of each parameter key. This technique will allow all related sub-nodes and elements to be properly grouped together (Sub-nodes encompass everything between "BoxID" and "Insurance").

"&BoxID1=YourBoxCode1" +

This is your internal code for identifying a particular box or package. The maximum length of this particular field is 15 characters.

"&Weight1=10" + "&WeightUnit1=LB" +

Specifies the weight of the package as well as the unit of measure. The weight may be any positive decimal number but may not exceed 150 LB, 2400 OZ, or 68.03 KG (anything beyond these limits is considered to be freight not parcel). Supported "WeightUnit"s include the following (each has a maximum length of 2 characters)...

- KG (Kilogram)
- LB (Pound)
- o OZ (Once)

Describes the container in which the parcel is to be shipped. Changes to this v2.0.3 of the XML API are:

- The LTR (Letter) value has been replaced with the ENV (Carrier Envelope) type, which carries the identical dimensional and weight considerations from a carrier perspective.
- CBX (Carrier Box) and CPK (Carrier Pak) have been added to include support for the carrier-supplied packaging options.

Supported codes include the following (each has a maximum length of 3 characters)...

3. Parse XML-formatted response string

The string returned back to the caller is in XML format and will therefore need to be parsed accordingly. Below is an example of the data and structure sent back to the caller or client.

Error Handling

Errors encountered by the quote engine are returned in XML format to the caller. There are two types of errors that could potentially happen. One is the result of the caller attempting to send invalid, un-properly formatted data to the quote engine and the other is the result of a specific carrier not providing rates for a given area (for some reason or other).

Error Syntax

...<error>x:y:z</error>...

x = Signifies one of two types of errors...

"0" – This is the most common type of error. It is typically the result of sending un-properly formatted/validated request parameters to the quote engine.

"1" – This type of error is most often generated as the result of a carrier either not supporting or not providing rates for a given area or locale (reasons may vary).

y = This is a numeric code or representation of the error

z = A short textual description of the error
